SUBWAY RIDE

It costs the city 7½ cents each time you ride on the Hillside Avenue Subway, the Board of Transportation revealed a few days ago.

And when that 7½ cents is multiplied by the millions of subway riders throughout the city, it becomes a billion-dollar problem, the board said in a 168-page analysis of its operations since 1940.

AUTO STAMP

Although President Truman has signed a bill repealing the \$5. Federal automobile use tax effective June 30th, it is still necessary to display the stamp until that date. Stamps for newly acquired vehicles can be purchased on a pro rata basis for the months remaining between the time of acquisition and the expiration date of that levy.

ONCE AGAIN

A new item of a few days ago tells us that five Queens residents were fined \$1. each and six others were given suspended sentences in Flushing Court for smoking in the subway.
