## TIPS FOR WINTER FIRE SAFETY

Fire safety is particularly important at this time of year. Follow these tips from the FDNY:

Keep live Christmas trees watered. Discard trees when they dry out.

If you buy an artificial tree, choose one that's fire retardant.

Inspect decorative lights and discard lights that are in poor condition.

When it comes time to feast during this holiday season, remember that cooking fires are the leading cause of home fires and home injuries.

If you must use space heaters, use only approved models that shut off automatically. Keep heaters away from combustible items, don't use extension cords and don't overload electrical outlets. Keep pets away from the space heaters, and keep space heaters away from contact with water, like in the bathroom. Remember to turn off and unplug space heaters when everyone leaves the room.

## SNOW FACTS

Some information from the Dept of Sanitation website:

Snow and ice must be cleared from sidewalks within these specific time-frames: If snowfall ends between 7am and 4:59pm, snow must be cleared within 4 hours. If snowfall ends between 5pm and 8:59pm, it must be cleared within 14 hours. Snowfall that ends between 9pm and 6:59am must be cleared from sidewalks by 11am. You may call 311 to make a complaint about snow or ice accumulations on public or private property.

It is illegal to throw snow out into the street. Doing so puts you at risk for receiving a summons, and makes things difficult for everyone.

The current NYC budget includes \$21 million in capital funding for new snow removal equipment, including smaller vehicles to plow narrow streets. This may be helpful on our area, since larger vehicles have difficulty making turns.

The Sanitation Dept. is again hiring temporary snow removal workers. Applicants must be at least 18 years old and able to perform heavy physical labor. Pay is \$15.00 per hour. Apply Monday-Saturday from 7 AM- 3 PM at the Sanitation garage at 75-05 Douglaston Pkwy (Winchester Blvd under the Grand Central Pkwy). You must bring 2 passport photos, Social Security card and two forms of ID. Payment will be by check in 4-6 weeks, but can take up to 12 weeks.

Plow NYC allows us to track the location of snow plows and salt trucks. Visit <u>http://maps.nyc.gov/snow/</u> or search for "Plow NYC."

#### FARM MUSEUM SWITCHING TO PRE-RESERVATIONS ONLY, FOR SOME EVENTS

Increasingly, events at the Queens County Farm Museum (73-50 Little Neck Parkway) are over-subscribed and are drawing crowds so large the staff and space are inadequate. The last event, the Children's Fall Festival, was so crowded, with lines to get in two blocks long, and traffic backed up to the Grand Central Parkway, that signs were placed on the gate that it was "Sold Out" the first time in 41 years that such action had to be taken. While not a problem for all events, some of the major ones, such as the Egg Hunt at Easter, will have to switch to pre-paid, on-line reservations only. Many institutions have already changed to this admission format.
