# NEW STATE SENATOR REPRESENTS OUR AREA: TOBY STAVISKY

The new year brings a significant change in our representation. Redistricting, the redrawing of boundaries of election districts, takes place every 10 years following the census.

This time, the boundaries changed so that the home of our sitting State Senator, John Liu, ended up in Senate District 16, which covers Flushing, Bayside and Fresh Meadows. In

November, Senator Liu ran for and won the senate seat for the 16th District. State Senator Toby Stavisky had held the seat in District 16 since 1999, when she won a special election to succeed her late husband, State Senator Leonard Stavisky. This past November, she ran for and won the senate seat in our district, District 11, which covers Bellerose, Queens Village, Douglaston, Little Neck Bay Terrace, Whitestone, and College Point.

Senator Stavisky currently serves as the Chairwoman of the Committee of Higher Education. She has graciously agreed to meet with us via Zoom at our January 9 meeting. Please join us to meet our newest elected official.

Call the NYC Department for the Aging at (212)-244-6469 or (311) to explain the emergency need for delivery of meals. The NYC Department for the Aging will make a determination and a case management agency assigned to the constituent's zip code or council district will work with the senior to determine meal delivery schedule.
- ♦ Mental Health Services for Adults Expands Across Queens: Commonpoint Queens has an Article 31 Outpatient Mental Health Clinic offering individual, group and family therapy as well as psychiatric evaluation and treatment. ## **FREE COVID TESTS**

The Federal government has arranged for the US Postal Service to deliver four free COVID test kits per person. Visit https://special.usps.com/testkits or call the Post Office at 1-800-275-8777.

Health insurance plans are required to cover the cost of at-home rapid tests for COVID-19. This applies to Medicare Part B, Medicare Advantage plans, Medicaid, and private insurers. Up to eight tests per person per calendar month will be covered for as long as the COVID public health emergency exists. Contact a pharmacy or your health plan for details.

Free test kits have been available at Queens Public Library branches while supplies last. Quantities may be limited.
