NEWS FROM THE 105TH PRECINCT STATIONHOUSE

The 105th Precinct Community Council meeting was held on February 25th. Because of the Holiday break in December and bad weather in January, this was the first meeting since November. Members of the community expressed condolences for the assassinations of Police Officers Ramos and Liu in December. The NYPD is recruiting for positions of Police Officer, School Safety Agent and Traffic Enforcement Agent. There will be a career day some time in May. - 2014 was a great year, with steep crime declines compared to 2013. In comparison to the low numbers in 2014, crime in early 2015 has increased in categories such as robberies, burglaries, and auto thefts.

precinct. One arrest has been made.

- Tire and rim thefts have increased after several months of decline. Most have involved late-model Hondas with gray custom rims, and have occurred late at night or before dawn. Try to park in driveways or other secure locations. Don't leave keys for wheel locks in visible locations in your car. Call 911 if thefts or suspicious activities are observed.
- Thefts of catalytic converters are down, but still occur. Vehicles like trucks and suburbans are vulnerable, because thieves can work under them without jacking up a vehicle. Consider having converters welded or covered with a cage. Try to park in a safe area.
- Six new rookie police officers have been assigned to the 105th.
