ROAD AND SIDEWALK WORK UNDERWAY

At our April 8 meeting, Jennifer Lester from the NYC Department of Design and Construction updated our membership on ongoing construction projects.

Capital Project QED 976 is the installation of a trunk water main, which includes a stretch of Braddock Ave. from Winchester Blvd. to 90 Ave. You may have experienced recent road closures on Braddock Ave. due to this work.

Ms. Lester stated that the resurfacing of Braddock Ave. is scheduled for completion by July, 2020, after all water main, sewer and utility work is completed on Braddock Ave. Members in attendance at the meeting emphasized the need for DDC and the NYC Dept. of Transportation (DOT) to properly grade Braddock Ave. due to the numerous depressions in the roadway. Ms. Lester stated that she would convey this to project engineers.

Another ongoing project is Storm Sewer Extension Project SEQ200531. This work starts at 239 St. and 87 Ave., extends east to the Cross Island Parkway service road, and then south past 90 Ave. 242 St. and the one-block stretches of 88 Ave., 88 Rd., 88 Dr., 89 Ave. and 90 Ave. are affected.

While this is going on, DDC is also coordinating sidewalk replacement work at several homes whose owners have received DOT sidewalk violations but have elected to pay NYC to do the repair work. (Note: This is not to be confused with the Trees and Sidewalks program administered by the NYC Parks Department. If sidewalk defects are found to be caused by city-owned trees, property owners are placed on a list to have repair work done at no cost).



Council Member Barry Grodenchik will install officers and board members of Creedmoor Civic at the May meeting.

All are welcome, and complimentary refreshments are served.

The DOT Division of Bridges will perform structural repairs on the Braddock Avenue Bridge over the Cross Island Parkway on week-nights from Monday, April 29, 2019 to Friday, May 31, 2019. These closures will occur between the hours of 1:00 am and 6:00 am and will begin and end approximately 300 feet before and after the bridge. At least one lane of traffic will be maintained in each direction at all times.
