NOTES FROM THE 105 PRECINCT

At the meeting held on October 26, Inspector Schiff reported that crime is down 9% for the month, and 5% for the year. In fact, this year is on track to be the 2nd best year for crime statistics in the 105th Pct since CompStat started in 1994. There has been 1 homicide this year vs 6 last year. Rapes were down (12 vs 31 reports in same period last year). Most involved dates or domestic relationships, as opposed to rapes by strangers.

Grand larcenies remain a problem. Of 52 Grand Larcenies, 19 were for identity theft. Seven scams were reported last month: 1 phone scam by someone representing himself as a Con Ed employee, one scam involving the rental of an apartment, and five Craig's List scams. Three of the five Craig's List scams involved the exchange of property, and two involved job placements. Inspector Schiff reminded those present that Craig's List transactions frequently involve a seller holding valuable property and a buyer who may have a large amount of cash. Be very careful when arranging a meeting with a stranger to perform a transaction.

Grand larcenies from automobiles were also a big problem. These occurred in two main categories: Theft of vehicle parts (6 cases), and theft of property from auto (13 cases). In almost all the property from auto incidents, the cars were unlocked.

Inspector Schiff made a few additional points:

60-70% of the crime in the 105th is done by people who live here. This makes community involvement very important, as we may recognize perpetrators from sketches or photos.

Footage from surveillance cameras is very helpful, even if it is from neighboring properties and doesn't show the actual crime. It may give a good view of a perpetrator approaching or leaving a crime scene.

Everyone should enable tracking capabilities in their smart phones. Tracking has led to many arrests involving stolen smart phones.
