### **ICCC TRIES AGAIN AT BSA**

On September 23, 2014, the Board of Standards and Appeals (BSA) held a public hearing regarding the revised proposal by the Indian Community and Cultural Center (ICCC).

The latest plan calls for a four story building, including a community center and 57 apartments, to be built on land that the ICCC acquired on the Creedmoor campus. State Senator Tony Avella, and leaders of several local civic associations (including the Creedmoor Civic Association) attended the hearing and made statements in opposition to the plan.

While acknowledging that the size and scale of this proposal has decreased, many opposition speakers stated that the building would still tower over and have a negative impact on nearby private residences. Concerns were also raised about the financial viability of the project, and the precedent it might set for future development of the Creedmoor Psychiatric Center campus. Another issue pertains to access and egress to and from the site by emergency vehicles and regular traffic.

BSA Chairperson Margery Perlmutter directed the ICCC to submit more information by October 28. Another public hearing is scheduled for November 25, 2014.

# CITY INSTALLS MORE TRAFFIC CAMERAS

As you may be aware, New York City now has the authority to deploy up to 140 speed cameras near schools throughout the city. We have received reports of motorists receiving \$50 tickets on Union Turnpike near the Padavan School campus, and on Hillside Avenue in the vicinity of Martin Van Buren High School. According to a NY Times article from September 2, the law provides for violations to be issued for speeds of more than 10 mph above the speed limit, at times when children can be expected to be present in school buildings. This would include summer school, and after-school activities.

#### CRIME DROPS IN THE 105 POLICE PCT.

The monthly 105th Precinct Community Council Meetings have resumed after a summer break. Deputy Inspector Coyle reported that crime is at historically low levels. Two hundred fewer crimes have been reported in the precinct year to date, as compared with the same period last year. This includes 100 fewer burglaries.

As of now, the 105th is the 3rd best precinct in the city in crime reduction year over year. Crime has diminished in and around Martin Van Buren HS, including a reduction in youth-on-youth robberies. Thefts of tires and wheels are way down, due in part to several arrests in the 105<sup>th</sup> and neighboring precincts.

Captain Gilbert, the 105<sup>th</sup> Pct. Executive Officer, discussed Vision Zero, a program to reduce traffic deaths and injuries, which is based on 3 E's: Education, Engineering and Enforcement. Current initiatives include enforcing laws requiring motorists to yield to pedestrians, and to stop in both directions for a school bus with flashing red lights.

Information was provided on various scams, including the following:

- One-Ring Phone Scam. Scammers ring a cell phone once, then hang up. When someone calls the number back, they are put on hold and charged per minute for an international call.
- Hotel Check-In Credit Card Scam. You give your credit card information to the desk clerk when you check in. Later that night, a scammer randomly calls your room. He says he is at the front desk, that there is a problem with your credit card, and would you mind reading your card number over the phone to confirm it. Don't do it!
- **E-Z Pass Phishing Scam.** You get an email that looks like it came from the E-Z Pass Service Center, asking you to download a list of unpaid tolls. Don't do it!

- All rigid plastics are now recyclable. Don't worry about the numbers on the item. Please rinse containers before recycling.
- ▶ If you can tear paper, it is recyclable.
- New stickers for your recycling pails are available at civic meetings.
- ►There is no longer a specific "bulk pickup day." However, it is better for the DSNY if larger items are put out for the second collection of the week.
- ►You may receive a summons for putting garbage out before 4 PM from Oct.1 through April 1, From April 1 through Oct. 1, garbage may not be put out before 5 PM.
- A composting pilot program is underway, involving all NYC public schools and selected neighborhoods. Organic waste is collected separately in a specially designed receptacle.
