REPORT ON POLICE COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING OF 9/27/17

Cop of the month awards were presented for the summer months. In two instances, officers were recognized for stopping vehicles for traffic infractions, and recovering handguns. Youth Officer Carleton Epps received a Cop-of-the-Month award. He co-chairs the Precinct Youth Council, oversees a very active Explorer Post, and counsels troubled youth and their families.

Crime is down 3% overall, year-to-year, but there some problems:

■ There were 6 shootings in August and September, in Rosedale, Laurelton and Queens Village. There were no fatalities. Investigations are ongoing.

■ Reports of domestic violence are increasing, and are having an impact on other crime statistics, like assaults and robberies. Insp. Schiff believes the increase may be because domestic violence is being reported more often. It may still be under reported. He said the crime is taken seriously and arrests are made.

■ Robberies are up. 20 robberies were reported in the precinct last month, vs 12 last year. Five of the 20 were related to domestic violence.

□ Grand larcenies are up, mostly for thefts from autos. Of the 32 grand larcenies, 7 occurred in Bellerose. In half of the thefts from vehicles, the cars were unlocked. Insp. Schiff also emphasized not to leave valuables visible in vehicles. While on patrol, officers who observe valuables in plain sight in vehicles sometimes run the plate number, and then contact the owner in person or by letter.

■ Thefts of tires and rims continues to be a problem. A college student who was arrested recently was in possession of rims from several of the thefts.

■ An attempted abduction of a 12 year old girl took place on 8/31 outside the Key Food on Jamaica Ave and 215 St. The child's mother was present and pulled the child away. The alleged perpetrator had several distinctive tattoos. He was arrested a few days later after police received several tips from the public.

The next council meeting will take place on Wednesday, October 25.
