RESTAURANTS SUE TO OPEN INDOOR DINING

A news conference took place on September 3 at Il Bacco Restaurant in Little Neck to announce a lawsuit against NYC and NYS for not yet allowing indoor dining in the 5 boroughs.

About 100 people turned out. They included other Queens restaurant owners (including London Lennie's, La Baraka French Restaurant, and the Greek Islands Restaurant across

Elected the street.) officials included City Council Members Eric Ulrich, Robert Holden (both Queens) and Mark Gjonaj (pronounced Joe-nye) (The Bronx). Also present were some candidates for public office. The parties to the lawsuit, including the Triple Crown Diner in Bellerose, are suing to open the restaurants and are also seeking monetary compensation. They object to the fact that all counties of New York State allow

some level of indoor dining, except for the 5 boroughs of NYC. The suit also demands that NYC show the science that justifies keeping NYC restaurants closed.

Because Bellerose is located on the Nassau County border, you are not allowed to dine indoors on the north side of Jericho Tpke, but it is allowed across the street. It has been reported that 1,300 NYC restaurants have already gone out of business. After outdoor dining ceases in the end of October, the remaining restaurants face extinction.

VANDERBILT PKWY CONSTRUCTION

Repairs to the Vanderbilt Motor Parkway will begin the week of September 21. The parkway is part of the world's first motor parkway, constructed in 1908. Originally, it extended to Lake Ronkonkoma. Now it runs through parks from Winchester Blvd to Peck Ave in Fresh Meadows. Phase 1 of this project, expected to last about one year, will reconstruct the section from Winchester Blvd to Springfield Blvd.

NEW TWIST TO AUTO CRIME

At the last Build the Block meeting, NCO Detective Shawn Gallagher and PO Christopher Spotts explained that it's possible for thieves to push the door button on a late model vehicle and activate the car's key fob if the fob is in your house near your front door. This may allow someone to gain entry to your car and maybe to drive it away. We have also learned that there are commercially available devices that thieves can use to activate key fobs near the front door. In either case, a solution would be to keep your keys away from the front door or store them in a box or envelope that blocks radio frequency transmissions (like the EZ-Pass envelope). These protective devices are available on-line and possibly in local stores.

POLL WORKERS NEEDED!

There is a shortage of poll workers for the upcoming Presidential election. Part of the problem is that many poll workers are senior citizens who may not want to work because of the Covid-19 pandemic. Also, early voting has increased the number of shifts that need to be covered. Someone who attends the training and works all 9 early voting days plus Election Day can earn up to \$2800.
