CREEDMOOR TENT CITY RUNNING AT FULL CAPACITY

The Creedmoor HERRC (Humanitarian Emergency Response and Relief Center) opened on August 15. There were 150 occupants by August 16, when a protest rally took place there. It is run by NYC Health and Hospitals.

On August 29, Borough President Donovan Richards held the second Zoom meeting on the facility. Some highlights from the meeting:

As of August 29th, there were 948 individuals at the Creedmoor site. The men come from countries including Columbia, Venezuela, Ukraine, Turkey, Russia, Mauritania, and many others. During intake at the Roosevelt Hotel, they are given a health screening including Covid, TB and Varicella tests, and vaccinations. There is repeat testing at Creedmoor.

Since the decision to open the Creedmoor tent city was made public, there have been three large rallies at that location, and several rallies at the offices of elected officials. A rally is planned for Friday, September 8. At the August 16 rally at least three arrests were made after protestors blocked traffic on Hillside Avenue in front of the gate to the Tent City.

About 90% of those arriving at Creedmoor have paperwork issued by security officials on the southern border. Each person meets with a caseworker to identify his needs: how to get a work permit, how to get OSHA training, how to take English classes, etc. About twenty men are discharged from the Creedmoor site each day because they have made other arrangements (job, family, friends, etc.).

NY State and NYC Health and Hospitals both have transition and relocation programs. Individuals are not given a stipend. Some are working for cash, mainly in construction or as delivery workers. It takes 150 days to qualify for a work permit. People who qualify for Temporary Protected Status can get work permits faster. TPS is for people from sixteen countries including, Afghanistan, El Salvador, Som-

alia, and Ukraine.

There are twenty security guards on site. The 105th Pct has two officers 24/7 at the entrance and NCOs are giving the site special attention. There is a security camera inside the campus.

To reduce crowding on buses that run near the HERC, a shuttle bus system has been established for transit to a Jamaica subway stop. Shelter managers are working with DOT to provide bike racks and corrals for e bikes and scooters. (Batteries are not allowed inside tents). Some of the concerns that were raised by local residents and elected officials: Congregating at Det. William Gunn Park on Hillside and 235 Ct; crowding and loitering at bus stops; trespassing on private property.
