SERVICE MEN

The Service Men's Committee of our Association, which sent out packages for almost four years to the boys and girls in service from our community, made possible by the contributions of their neighbors, has had a special medal struck, a medal that is a work of art and admired by all who have seen it.

These medals, upon which the name of the recipient has been inscribed, will be presented at a get-together on Saturday Evening, May 18th at our headquarters. This re-union will be exclusively for the service and ex-service men and women whose names appear on our Honor Roll. We use the word "service" men and women because there are a number still in service and they may be able to arrange a pass or leave to attend. But we wish to emphasize that this is for the boys and girls only and it will give them an opportunity to swap stories.

The Committee has mailed post cards to all and has asked that they be returned without delay. In order to arrange the program for the entire evening, the Committee must know how many will attend. Therefore, get those post cards back AT ONCE.

DRIVE

Our membership drive thus far is meeting with success which is borne out by the fact that over 75 new members were taken into our association at our last meeting and there are about 50 applicants to be acted upon at our next meeting. This will bring our total to well over 300, the highest in the history of our association.

PROCLAMATION

President Truman has proclaimed Sunday, May 12th, as "Mother's Day" and called for its nation-wide observance.

The proclamation said that it was especially appropriate this year after victory "on a thousand momentus fields of battle" that the Country "express the debt of gratitude which each of us owes to his own mother and which we all owe to the mothers of America."

He asked observance of the day with "public and private expressions of honor, reverence and love."

JUST A REMINDER

But remember this, if the last day of April passed on without your paying your taxes for the last half of 1945-46, you are being penalized with interest for nonpayment at the rate of 7 per cent per annum from the first of April to date of payment.

MORATORIUM

Governor Dewey signed the Janes Bill continuing the mortgage moratorium which began in 1933, until July 1, 1947.

The statute provides that mortgages covered by the moratorium cannot be foreclosed if interest and taxes are paid and 3% annually paid upon the principal.

WARNING

Because of the prevalence of rabies, acting Commissioner of Health Weinstein urged every dog owner to keep his dog on a leash, under control and away from other dogs whenever the dog is in a public place.
