WATER LOW

Threat of a water shortage has brought an appeal from Mayor O'Dwyer asking householders to cut water use as much as possible.

The mayor said yesterday the water level in city reservoirs already is down half-way. He said the reservoirs can't be filled from upstate sources fast enough to beat the present withdrawal of water.

The mayor called the situation "most serious."

He said executive oroders already have gone out to city departments to cut water use. The Sanitation Department has been instructed to stop using water from fire hydrants to wash streets and public fountains are being turned off.

YOUR VOTE COUNTS

America's Public Enemy No. 1 is going to wake up a week from today, take a look at his newspaper and start moaning:

"Good Lord, look who they've elected."

He will weary his wife with loud cries of lamentations:

"The country's gone to the dogs. What a place this will be to live in for the next four years."

Who is this human eight-ball? I'll tell you his name. His name is legion. He is democracy's worst foe. He could be the guy who lives next door or in the apartment over you. He may be you yourself.

He is, in short, the guy who won't have voted—the little man who wasn't there.

He is the guy who thinks he knows exactly what's wrong with his country—and won't take a few small steps to the polls to help set it right.

Come next Wednesday he'll have a lot of reasons, all bad, for why he didn't bother to do in the secrecy of a voting booth what John Hançock once dared to do in the open—at the risk of a king's anger.

This man with a citizenship quota of minus zero will explain away his failure to back what he believes in by saying:

"I forgot to register."

Or, "I had something else to do, and there was a line at the polls."

Or, "I just didn't like any of the candidates all the way."

Or, he may capsule his whole futility into the common excuse:

"Oh, well, what does my vote count anyway."

The trouble with that attitude is that no man is ever in a position to be sure how much or how little his vote counts,

Voting in America is now clean, safe and anonymous. It just take a little bit of trouble.

But what quiet men fought to win in battle can be easily lost in peacetime by men of lazy conscience whose sense of duty needs an alarm clock.

"X" marks the fate of any democracy where the people won't take the bother to scratch "X" on a ballot.

An Associated Press news dispatch from Chicago under date of Oct. 13th reads as follows: Chicagoans will pay more to ride their elevated-subway trains, street cars and busses, starting Saturday. The Chicago Transit Board today increased the elevated-subway fares two cents—from 15 to 17 cents. SUBWAY FARES

The Board of Transportation in an effort to improve the service on the Hillside Ave, subway during rush hours, has inaugurated a new schedule which calls for a train out of Jamaica every minute and a half during the morning rush, half of them E trains starting at 169th St., the others "F" trains starting at Parsons Blvd.

A new schedule also changes the route of the "E" trains during rush hours. Instead of terminating at the Broadway-Lafayette Station, they continue along the regular 8th Ave. Line route to Broadway-Nassau and then on to East N. Y. via Fulton St., Brooklyn.

We haven't heard any comments on these changes but any effort to improve the service will be greatly appreciated. Observing the swarms of people going into and coming out of the subway entrances during the rush hours clearly indicates the tremendous increase in population in communities east, north and south of Jamaica and if it continues it may create a situation that will take a long time to remedy. AUTO KEYS

The City Council and the Board of Estimate have approved a proposed law that would make it unlawful to leave a motor vehicle unattended in city streets for more than three minutes with the key in the ignition switch or with the ignition unlocked.

The measure provides a fine of \$5, imprisonment up to two days, or both. Police would be empowered to remove ignition keys from vehicles and take them to the nearest precinct station.

Sponsors of this bill claim it will remove temptation from youths who like to jump into parked cars with keys in the ignition ready to go. It is said similar laws in other cities have cut juvenile crime 90%. This bill is now on Mayor O'Dwyer's desk awaiting his signature.
